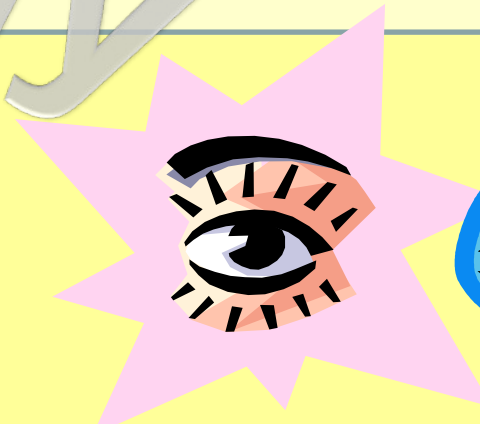
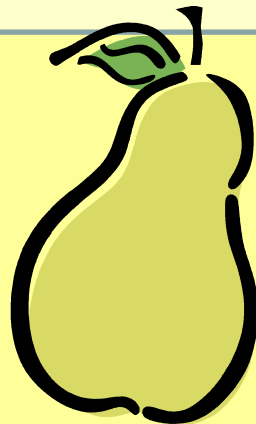




Homophones

hole in.

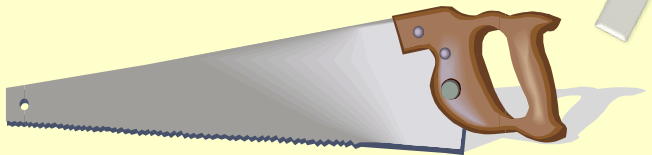

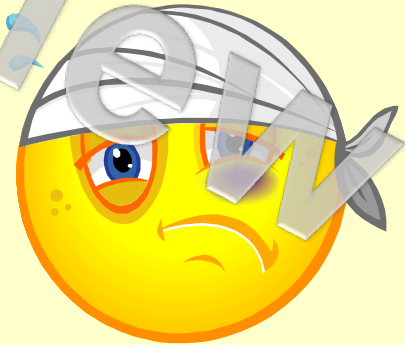
